College of Social and Behavioral Sciences Dean's Curriculum Innovation Mini-Grant Summer 2022

A Call for Inter-/Multi-Disciplinary Certificates

Due Date: April 8, 2022

The Dean of the College of Social and Behavioral Sciences announces the availability of CSBS Curriculum Innovation Mini-Grants. The aim of these grants is to support multiple teams of 3 – 5 tenured, probationary, and/or term faculty from within CSBS (or CSBS interdisciplinary programs such as Women's & Gender Studies) to develop innovative proposals for inter-/multi-disciplinary certificates. The teams can develop certificates that would become part of UNIFI or as standalone academic offerings. These grants provide a stipend of \$500 per person. Award monies will be paid as special compensation in either May or June 2022, depending on the timeline of the team.

The subject and/or content of the certificates is completely open to the teams. Some certificate possibilities that have already been discussed include a Civic Education and Engagement certificate for UNIFI, a Social Science Data and Methods certificate, a Leadership certificate, and a Human Behavior and Sustainability certificate.

Requirements

- 1. Consult with and inform department heads of proposal plans.
- 2. Complete the attached cover page with requested information, including department head signatures.
- 3. Provide a proposal of no more than 3 pages.
 - a. Summarize the project, including how the team members will work together.
 - b. Indicate the need for the proposal and the benefits to CSBS and/or the larger university.
 - c. Provide a timeline for how the work will be completed (see sample timeline below).
- 4. Successful applicants cannot have already exceeded their 2021-2022 special compensation cap.
- 5. Applications for this challenge grant are due to the Dean's Office by **12 p.m., Friday, April 8, 2022.** Please email the applications to Gregory.Bruess@uni.edu.
- Successful applicants will provide a summary progress report to the Dean's Office by 12 p.m., Thursday, June 30, 2022. This report should be no longer than 2 pages and should also attach any products (i.e., curriculum proposals, SOA plans, etc.). Email progress report to Gregory.Bruess@uni.edu.



Sample Timeline

Week of 5/23: Faculty meet for 2 hours to discuss possibilities, begin on framework of minor/certificate by discussing learning outcomes (LOs) or objectives of curriculum. Faculty members have assignments to complete before next meeting. 1-2 hours of prep time

Week of 5/30: Faculty meet for 2 hours to finalize objectives & start populating courses within minor/certificate. Faculty members have individual assignments to follow up with colleagues / dept heads, work on new course descriptions as needed

Week of 6/6: Faculty meet for 1-2 hours to complete a draft of the minor/certificate. Faculty do individual work on any course level changes necessary to LOs, prereqs, course descriptions.

Week of 6/13: Faculty deliver draft proposals to relevant colleagues & department heads for feedback.
