Final Analysis: Since all students met or exceeded the expectations for all assignments aligned with their respective KPI's, the coordinator assessment will hold a meeting with the IT director and Blackboard consultant about developing rubrics that provide more statistical specificity per item in addition to global scores. This level of granular analysis will allow for statistical differentiation analysis that can allow the faculty to determine the areas of growth and correction. This meeting will take place at the end of the spring semester 2023 and the recommendations will be incorporated in the fall 2023 semester.
