Tom Eachus, Executive Director of Black Hawk-Grundy Mental Health Center, is a Licensed Independent Social Worker in the State of Iowa. He began working at the Black Hawk Grundy Mental Health Center in 1988 coordinating their Community Support Program. In 1993, he was appointed Executive Director. He continues to provide a variety of clinical services to consumers of the Center as well as serving on a number of local and statewide advisory boards and committees.
